Our Theme Verse this year:

I rejoice at Your word as one who finds great treasure. Psalm 119:162

In the evil times, we have to fight hard for divine truth. Every doctrine costs us a battle. But when we gain a full understanding of eternal truth by personal struggles, it becomes doubly precious to us. If we have uncommon battling for the Word of God, may we have for our spoil a firmer hold upon the priceless Word!

Perhaps the passage means that the psalmist rejoiced like someone who comes upon hidden treasure for which he has not fought. In this case, we find the analogy in the man of God who, while reading the Bible, makes grand and blessed discoveries of the grace of God stored up for him – discoveries which surprise him, for he had not looked to find such a prize. Whether we come by the truth as finders or as warriors fighting for it, the heavenly treasure should be equally dear to us. With quiet joy the plowman slips home with his golden find! How victors shout as they share the plunder! How glad that person should be who has discovered his portion in the promises of Holy Scripture and is able to enjoy that portion for himself, knowing by the witness of the Holy Spirit that it is all his own!

Women's Ministry Bible Study On Psalm 119:113-176

We invite ladies, Jr. High age and older, to attend the Women's Bible Study. We are sorry, but no childcare will be provided and children are not permitted to attend with the exception of infants not yet crawling whose Moms will only be able to attend the Moms' Group in the Nursery Hallway. The Studies are held once-a-month on Tuesday evenings from September to May (no April Study). You can see the dates below. On those dates we will have speakers who will be teaching on Psalm 119. Their bios are on pages 8-11. After the teaching, we will have optional Small Discussion Groups that meet in various locations to discuss our homework and the 8 verses we studied that month and to pray together. The homework is listed below. You will need to register to be in a Small Discussion Group when you come to the Study. Please read the New Information on how to register for a group this year on page 3.

There will be NO Introduction Night this year in September.

The Study and the Small Discussion Groups will begin on September 24th. If you come to the Study that night and would like to register to be in a Small Discussion Group, be sure to do your homework prior to the first Study. We will be discussing the first 8 verses—Psalm 119:113-120.

How to Register to be in a Small Discussion Group

- **1. Registration is required:** If you would like to be in a Small Discussion Group, registration is required. Please do not go to a group without registering to be in that group.
- 2. If you were part of a Small Discussion Group in the last 2 years: If you would like to be in that group again this year, you will still need to register.
- 3. New Way to Register: In the fall when the Study first starts up, there are many ladies wanting to register to be in a Small Discussion Group. To make registering easier, from 6:45-7:10pm we will be doing registration at tables in the front foyer from September-November only. From 8:20-8:25pm we will also be doing registration from September-November at tables in the front foyer and from December-May at the center kiosk.
- **4. Once you register to be in a group:** The registration ladies will give you a nametag with that group # on it so when you go to the group, the Leaders will know that you have registered for their group.
- **5.** Registration at the Study only: In order to register, you must come to the Study and register in person. You will not be able to email or call us to register.
- **6. Once a group is full:** When a group is filled up, that group will be full and no one else can register to join that group.
- 7. If you are no longer able to attend the Bible Study: If you registered to be in a group and you are no longer able to attend the Bible Study, please contact Women's Ministry and let us know so we can remove you from the group and we can register someone else to be in that group. Small Discussion Groups

We will have 10 Small Discussion Groups throughout the building and 2 groups specifically for Moms and Widows. There will be a Map showing where all of the groups are located when you come to the Study to register for a group.

Moms & Moms with infants not yet crawling Group and the Widows Group:

If you are a Mom, you can choose to go to any Small Discussion Group you would like to, you do not need to go to this group. But if you are a Mom with an infant, we do ask that you only go to the Moms' Small Discussion Group. No other children will be permitted to attend and no childcare is provided so you will need to keep your infant with you. If you are a Widow, you can choose to go to any Small Discussion Group you would like to, you do not need to go to this group. These groups are not support groups, they will be studying Psalm 119:113-176 together just as the other groups are.

- 1. Discussion Group for Moms & Moms with infants not yet crawling: This group has a new location and will meet in the Nursery Hallway instead of the Jr. High Room where they met previously. If you are a Mom and would like to be in a discussion group to meet other Moms, we are offering this group to you. If you are a Mom with an infant, not yet crawling, you may bring your baby to the Bible Study in the Sanctuary and to this discussion group. We will have a section reserved for you in the Sanctuary by the Prayer Room and you may bring your strollers. If you are in the Sanctuary with your baby during the Study and your baby gets fussy or needs to be fed, please take him/her out of the Sanctuary. You may go to the Nursing Moms room located in the Nursery Hallway to feed your baby. There will be a closed circuit TV in there where you can continue to watch the Study live.
- **2. Discussion Group for Widows:** This group will meet in the Koinonia Room. If you are a widow and would like to be in a discussion group to meet other widows and to encourage one another through this season of life, we are offering this group to you.

Homework

We are having the Small Discussion Groups at the first Study on September 24th on Psalm 119:113-120 so we encourage you to do your homework prior to the first Study so you can be prepared.

There are 2 Required Resources for the Study this year:

- 1. Your Bible A Study Bible is also a great resource if you have one.
- 2. "Walking in His Ways Psalm 119: Scripture Writing Journal" This is the same journal that we have used for the past 2 years. If you have not purchased it yet, please purchase it prior to the first Study on September 24th so you can do your homework ahead of time, it is for sale in the Bookstore for \$5.00.

Optional, Not Required, Study Resources if you would like to use them:

Here are some good resources on Psalm 119 that we have recommended the past 2 years if you do not already have them:

- "The Golden Alphabet" by Charles Spurgeon a commentary on Psalm 119; it is for sale in the Bookstore for \$12.00. This commentary is also available as an audiobook on audible.com.
- We have printed 2 commentary pamphlets on Psalm 119: "Exploring Psalms Volume 2: An Expository Commentary" by John Phillips, the chapter on Psalm 119:105-112 called "The Lamp" and "Treasures in the Psalms" by Henry Morris. If you have not already gotten one, they will be available at the center kiosk when you come to the Bible Study.
- Pastor Joe Focht on Psalm 119 listen on the church app or website. Go to **resources.ccphilly.org** and click on Teaching Library.
- Blue Letter Bible– blueletterbible.org it provides online tools helpful for studying the Bible.

Homework

If you are attending the Study for the first time, read the Introduction in the Psalm 119 Journal. This Scripture writing journal might be a new way of studying the Word for some of you. In this Introduction, you will find helpful tips and suggestions for Scripture writing, but the overall intention of this journal is to be a flexible and practical tool to help you develop your own system of writing Scripture. The Scripture writing journal is divided into 22 stanzas of 8 verses each. There are 3 pages in the journal to write your thoughts about each stanza, but if you need more pages to write your notes as you study, you can use another notebook or journal to go along with this one. You do not need to limit yourself to just those 3 pages. The sample journal entry is just that, only a sample. You do not have to write out all the verses and then study them, you can write them out one at a time and put your thoughts under each one. This is your own personal journal for you to share what God showed you if you choose to be in a discussion group. Or you can use this journal for your own personal study or do it with friends.

Some suggestions as you study each month:

- 1. Pray and ask the Lord to speak to you through His Word.
- 2. Read the 8 verses in the Bible we will be studying each month. Take your time and meditate on each verse, and let God speak to you personally.
- 3. Put the date at the top of the page in your journal, this will help you remember what God told you on the date you studied it. You do not need to journal every day if you're busy, just continue the next day that you have time.
- 4. Write out in your journal the first verse of the 8 verses you are studying. Writing out the verse will help you remember it and maybe even memorize it.
- 5. On the verse you just wrote in your journal, you could highlight, underline, or circle any words or parts of the verse that have particular meaning to you. You can also look up definitions of the words. A Study Bible is a great tool because it has footnotes and cross references that will help you learn more about each verse. Write the things that God shows you in your journal.
- 6. Asking yourself questions or praying about what the verse says helps you apply the Word to your life. For example: Psalm 119:2 says, "Blessed are those who keep His testimonies, who seek Him with the whole heart!" Question: "Lord, do I seek you with my whole heart?" Prayer: "Please help me seek you more!"

Outreach for CC Word of Life

Calvary Chapel Word of Life was born out of a Bible Study in the YMCA in North Philadelphia led by Pastor Mark Abrams. This study was simply a group of believers coming together who had a hunger for the truth. The desire and emphasis of this ministry was to teach through the entire bible verse-by-verse, as Paul told those in Ephesus, "For I have not shunned to declare to you the whole counsel of God" Acts 20:27. This small Bible study continued to grow as the Word of God was being taught and became a church plant.

Seeking to reach the community with the gospel, the Lord afforded this fellowship the privilege to do countless outreaches serving single moms, fatherless children and the homeless. Calvary Chapel Word of Life has formed several partnerships with homeless shelters - Self-Incorporated, one of the city's largest homeless shelter agencies in the city, and Woodstock Shelter that services homeless married couples with children. These partnerships afford us countless opportunities to minister to the homeless population long-term.

Calvary Chapel Word of Life considers itself a daughter church of Calvary Chapel of Philadelphia led by Senior Pastor Joe Focht. A ministry that God has been growing for over 40 years.
